

- Writer/director Spike Lee has been honoured with an extensive display reflecting his career (thus far) at the recently opened Academy Museum of Motion Pictures in Los Angeles. As reported in the LA Times, Spike previewed the exhibition on Friday, Sep 24 and said: "I'm elated. I'm happy and honoured that this exhibition is here for the opening of the museum." However, he noticed there were no items referencing his work with or about Michael Jackson, i.e. "They Don't Care About Us" and the documentaries "Bad 25," and "Michael Jackson from Motown to Off the Wall."

 "MJ should be up there!" said Spike. "You gotta have Michael in here. I know they're going to rotate stuff, but Michael Jackson can't be coming off the bench. He's gotta be in the game when the horn blows!" Indeed!
- MJ memorabilia to help fund African COVID care
 As reported in NME, money from the sale of Michael Jackson
 memorabilia seized from the Vice President of Equatorial
 Guinea will help pay for COVID-19 vaccines in the African
 country. Around \$27million of assets was confiscated from
 Teodorin Nguema Obiang Mangue including luxury vehicles
 and a pair of \$275,000 jewel-encrusted gloves belonging to
 MJ, according to the US Department of Justice. The United
 Nations will receive \$19.25million to buy and distribute
 vaccines in Equatorial Guinea, while \$6.35million will be
 handed over to a US-based charity "for the purchase and
 distribution of medicines and medical supplies throughout
 Equatorial Guinea," the justice department added.
- Update on Safechuck and Robson appeals MJJRepository on Twitter has advised that the appellate court has DISMISSED James Safechuck's appeal after his lawyer Vince Finaldi failed to submit an opening brief by Sep 24, as ordered, after 121 days of extensions. Finaldi now has until Oct 15 to appeal the dismissal of his appeal. He is also still appealing the dismissal of Wade's case and associated fines.
- Comedy movie "The Glove" in the works
 A comedy movie called The Glove, about two friends in search of Michael Jackson's (mythical) training glove will be directed by Tim Kirkby commencing March 2022 according to NME. Bob Mortimer and Vic Reeves will star. Mortimer explained it as a madcap road movie across Britain. "Vic and Bob are childhood friends who own a junk shop together where they both work and live. Profits are down and with their futures in jeopardy, they approach their obnoxious landlord to explain their 'rent' problems. Rather than helping them, the unsavoury character gives them a choice: eviction, or locate for him a rare and unusual item... Michael Jackson's training glove."
- New MJ bench seat for Mistelbach statue

 The fan-created statue of Michael located in Mistelbach,
 Austria now has a special MJ themed bench seat. As shared
 on the Denkmal 4 Michael Jackson group's Facebook page,
 Vivien Rose and Martina Kainz had the idea to create the
 sponsored garden bench with MJ's toe-stand silhouette in
 wood for the armrests. Johann Weichselbaum from the
 Comradeship Association of Lower Austria and also a member
 of the Organisation "Flame of Peace" handcrafted the sides of
 the bench and installed them as a belated birthday present for
 Michael Jackson and the fans worldwide.
- On the Line sells out MJ Music Day event An MJ Music Day "in the studio" organised by the On the Line Michael Jackson fan club, France, has sold all available tickets for its Oct 9 event. To be held at the Abbey Road Institute in Paris, the event will be hosted by Brice Najar aided by photographer Christophe Boulmé. - HIStory Album certified 11xPlatinum in Denmark Michael's double album "HIStory, Past, Present and Future, Book 1" has been certified 11x Platinum for sales exceeding 220,000 copies by the IFPI Denmark, the Danish subsidiary of the International Federation of the Phonographic Industry. Platinum and gold certifications awarded by IFPI Denmark are in recognition of sales milestones include streaming audio data, with 1,000 streams counting as a "sale". - J5 coloured vinyl releases for Record Store Day This year's annual Record Store Day special releases in the US will include a limited edition (1,500 copies) blue vinyl reissue of the Jackson 5 album 'ABC' on Nov 26. - Neverland Playlists available on YouTube
 Brad Sundberg has put together playlists of the music Michael had playing at Neverland. The playlists are accessible on YouTube and feature the exact versions on the music used at the ranch. - Drake v MJ 'battle' gets Michael trending When Billboard asked on Twitter "Is Drake in 2021 as big as Michael Jackson or The Beatles at their peaks?" MJ fans posted the obvious answer to that question, stating Michael's long list of achievements, and impact on popular culture. Conor Lochrie suggests in his article that such comparisons are "recency bias out of control." Nevertheless, as a result of all the tweets generated by MJ fans, his name and different song titles trended in many countries – providing yet another example of the strength of his living legacy.
- Bill Nation interviewed by Brice Najar
 In another of his insightful interviews involving Michael's HIStory and Blood on the Dance Floor years, French MJ fan and author Brice Najar ("Let's Make HIStory" and "Book on the Dance Floor") spoke with Bill Nation who photographed Michael in numerous countries, on set for his short films and on stage in concert. Bill reminds us that Michael was someone who really liked people and being able to meet people and walk in the crowd. "There were two guys, you know the professional Michael and just Michael."

- lconic MJ guitarist Jennifer Batten is on the cover of the latest Pathways magazine which features an article about her Guitar Cloud Symposium, an online community of guided interactive guitar classes with professionals. There is also a section in which Jennifer talks about working with Michael Jackson as well as Jeff Beck. "Michael Jackson taught me the value of relentless rehearsal to make a show the best it can be," Jennifer says. "We rehearsed for a solid two months for the Bad tour in 1987. The result was pure relaxed confidence on opening night... His goal was to move people emotionally, and to wow them with things they never experienced before." MJ Candlelight concerts in France

Two Candlelight concerts featuring the Yako Quartet will be held in France paying tribute to Michael Jackson. The concerts, which as the name suggests are conducted by candlelight, are in Toulouse on 22 and 23 October, and Paris on 25 October, with two shows per night on each date. The Wiz live on stage in Manchester

The first new UK stage production of The Wiz in 10 years will be performed at the Hope Mill Theatre in Manchester from 24 Nov to 16 January. First opening on 21 October 1974 at the Morris A. Mechanic Theatre in Baltimore, The Wiz moved on to Broadway and subsequently won seven Tony Awards in 1975. The big budget film production of 1978 featured Michael playing the Scarecrow – a performance that prompted high praise from critics and remains much loved by fans. Escorting Michael to the World Music Awards

In a recent article in Newsweek, private security contractor Simon Nelson related his experience of looking out for Michael on his visit to London for the World Music Awards. "In 2006, I was home on leave... when I got a call asking if I was available to work in London," Simon recalls. It wasn't until the next day when he arrived at Heathrow Airport that he discovered who the VIP was. Simon describes Michael as "nice; very calm and very quiet. I always remember him being very polite. He wasn't loud and he didn't move around quickly. He would slowly sit down and slowly lean forward. He was pleasant and softly spoken."
